A Goldman Sachs analyst, Judy Hong, said the restructuring was a natural move for Reynolds, as the tobacco industry finds ways to cope with declining cigarette sales. Americans are buying 3 to 4 percent fewer cigarettes a year, and the industry has turned to alternatives like chewing tobacco, snuff, cigars and snus (a tobacco pouch meant to be

held under the upper lip) for future growth. Sales of smokeless tobacco are growing by about 5 to 6 percent a year.
